HOW Planning has secured an outline planning application for the £220m Talbot Gateway scheme in Blackpool on behalf of Muse Developments. Following extensive pre-application work, HOW prepared and submitted the Environmental Assessment and Retail Assessment, led the community consultation exercise and project managed the complex application submission, working with a team of consultants from London and Manchester.



The mixed-use development will deliver a comprehensive regeneration of part of the town around Blackpool North Station and Talbot Road On the edge of the town centre. It comprises 85,000 square metres of new office and business space - complemented by a major food superstore, hotels, shops, cafes and restaurants. The proposals also include new headquarters offices for Blackpool Borough Council which is seeking to centralise many of its services and over 1500 staff at Talbot Gateway.

The project will totally transform an extensive area of the town, providing a new focus and a starting point for the much wider regeneration of Blackpool town centre.
