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Step Change For Former Territorial Army Site

Acting on behalf of Brackenhouse Properties, Manchester based specialists HOW Planning have submitted a full planning application for a 3.6 ha (9 acres) housing development in Macclesfield, Cheshire.

87 new homes will be built on the land previously occupied by the Territorial Army. The former TA centre was empty for a long period of time and has now been demolished to make way for redevelopment.

The 3.6 hectare site, which borders onto Chester Road will include a combination of traditional family homes and apartments with extensive landscaping, open space and wooded areas. Plans for a new pond further enhance the character of the site, contributing to the diversity of the area.

Says Jon Suckley, Principal Planner at HOW Planning: "Our client's vision is to create a high quality housing development which will attract new residents to the area. The site has been vacant for some time and these plans will regenerate what is currently a vacant parcel of land into an attractive and sensitively landscaped new community."

The application also includes plans for a new traffic controlled junction off Chester Road into the proposed development along with new public access routes.
